Background

The integration of AI into higher education offers a unique opportunity—not to replace educators, but to rethink their roles. Educators are now called upon to balance the strengths of AI with the irreplaceable value of human connection and judgment. This requires a pedagogical shift toward blended approaches that merge digital tools with experiential, soft skills-oriented learning.

Ultimately, the conference theme aims to provide a platform for researchers, educators, and policy-makers to share insights, experiences, and hands-on strategies for ensuring that higher education remains both future-ready and deeply human-centered in the age of AI.
